

The "Anglesey Rally Challenge" is free to enter and all competitors competing on any of the events at the Anglesey Circuit / Trac Môn will automatically be included in the series. The MSA Championship Registration is held by the Association of North-Western Car Clubs

[1] The qualifying rounds will provisionally be as follows:

Feb 28	Slaters Stages Rally	Caernarvonshire & Anglesey MC
Apr 25	Lee Holland Memorial Rally	Pendle DMC + Garstang & Preston MC
Jun 20	Enville Stages Rally	Warrington & DMC
Nov 6 *	Glyn Memorial Stages Rally 1	Caernarvonshire & Anglesey MC
Nov 7 *	Glyn Memorial Stages Rally 2	Caernarvonshire & Anglesey MC

\* 2-day event – it will not be permissible to enter for one day only. Competitors retiring on the first day will be permitted to run on the second under "Trophy Rally" regulations. For the purpose of Challenge points the two days will be treated as two separate events.

[2] Competitors will be divided into classes based on the actual engine size of the car in which they are competing.

[3] The classes for the Challenge will be

- (A) Cars with engine size up to 1400cc inclusive;
- (B) Cars with engine size 1401 to 1600cc inclusive;
- (C) Cars with engine size 1601 to 2000cc inclusive;
- (D) Cars with engine size over 2000cc, including forced-induction and rotary-engined cars (x 1.7).

The Eligibility Scrutineer appointed for this championship is Chris Mansley, Anat, 9 Cox Green Road, Egerton, Bolton, Lancashire, BL7 9HF.

[4] If event classes differ from Challenge classes then class placings will be revised to suit the Challenge.

[5] Points scoring system - In each Challenge class competitors will score points on the basis of 50-48-46-44-etc. Additionally, competitors will score overall classification points on the basis of 75-74-73-etc. The competitors score for the event shall be the total of the class and overall points.

[6] The maximum points score for the Challenge will be the competitors' best four results. In the event of a tie the competitor with the greater number of higher scores, taking all scores into account, will be declared the winner. If a tie still exists then the winner will be the competitor with the highest overall event placing. On a 2-day event each day will be counted separately, thereby creating five championship rounds. Points will be published on [www.anwcc.org](http://www.anwcc.org) and on [www.angleseycircuit.com](http://www.angleseycircuit.com) and also at each event. Any query must be submitted within seven days of the individual event results being declared final.

[7] Trophies will be presented to the 1<sup>st</sup> Overall Driver & Co-Driver; 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in class Driver & Co-Driver; 1<sup>st</sup> Novice Driver & Co-Driver; 1<sup>st</sup> Newcomer Driver & Co-Driver (competitor who has not competed at Anglesey Circuit previously). Competitors winning overall awards will not be eligible for class awards. To be eligible for an award a competitor must have started a minimum of three qualifying rounds. Other awards may be added and competitors will be advised.
